Ask Your Members of Congress

U.S. HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES

Ask your Representative to oppose the Barton draft Universal Service Fund bill or any similar legislation.

• If enacted, the legislation would basically eliminate the High-Cost universal service program.

Ask your Representative to cosponsor H.R. 2054, the Universal Service Reform Act of 2007, introduced by Representatives Rick Boucher (D-VA) and Lee Terry (R-NE).

- Expands the base of service providers and revenues subject to universal service contributions.
- States that support received by carriers should be based on their actual costs.
- Imposes a cap on the High-Cost program, which OPASTCO opposes and will seek to remove from the legislation.

Ask your Representative to cosponsor H.R. 278, introduced by Congresswoman Barbara Cubin (R-WY), which permanently exempts the Universal Service Fund from the Antideficiency Act accounting requirements.

 Legislation needs to be enacted by the end of the year, before the temporary one-year exemption expires.

U.S. SENATE

Ask your Senator to cosponsor S. 2919, introduced by Senator Ted Stevens (R-AK), which seeks to combat "phantom traffic."

- Creates the obligation that voice communications service providers ensure that all calls contain sufficient information to reasonably facilitate intercarrier billing.
- Extends the obligation to VoIP and intermediate providers.

Ask your Senator to cosponsor S. 609, introduced by Senators Jay Rockefeller (D-WV) and Olympia Snowe (R-ME), which permanently exempts the Universal Service Fund from the Antideficiency Act accounting requirements.

• Legislation needs to be enacted by the end of the year, before the temporary one-year exemption expires.
