WTA Awards Jack H Rhyner Award To James W. Frame

SAN FRANCISCO, CA – (OCTOBER 2, 2013) – The Western Telecommunications Alliance (WTA) announced yesterday at its 2013 Fall Annual Meeting that James W. Frame of the National Exchange Carrier Association (NECA) was awarded the Jack H Rhyner Award by the association's outgoing president James Woody of Union Telephone Company (WY).
