**Daron K. Roberts** is a former NFL coach, founding director of the Center for Sports Leadership and Innovation (CSLI) at the University of Texas and author of *A Kids Book About Empathy* and *Call an Audible*. A former venture capital partner, Daron is an active investor and private equity advisor.

Call an Audible was tabbed as a #1 New Release and Best Seller by Amazon, and Sports Illustrated selected the book as one of its "Best Sports Business Books." A Kids Book About Empathy was named to "Oprah's Favorite Things" list.

An active writer on issues ranging from corporate culture to leadership, Roberts was honored as LinkedIn's #1 Top Voice in Sports. Daron is a graduate of the University of Texas, the Harvard Kennedy School, and Harvard Law School.

Andrew Berke, Administrator, Rural Utilities Service, USDA has nearly three decades of experience as a political leader and elected official. He was the Mayor of Chattanooga, Tennessee from 2013 to 2021 where he served more than 180,000 residents and improved the efficiency and day-to-day operations of local government. Under Andy's leadership, Chattanooga operated its own wastewater system and received national recognition for improving access to high-speed internet for underserved communities. Andy was named Municipal Leader of the Year by American City and County magazine in 2015 and City Executive of the Year by State Scoop in 2020. He was also named Digital Inclusion Trailblazer by the National Digital Inclusion Alliance in 2020.

*Gerard J. Duffy* has been Regulatory Counsel for *WTA – Advocates for Rural Broadband* since its formation and was counsel to WTA's Western Alliance predecessor. He has long focused on rural telecommunications issues, and also has experience with commercial mobile radio, Internet, and cable television matters.
